Dear Parents/Caregivers, Staff and Students

It is that time of the year when we formally begin planning for the 2017 school year. A key aspect of this planning is the course counselling process which occurred in Week 4 of this term. Students in Years 8 - 11, and their parents/ caregivers, attended counselling interviews to choose subjects based on their interests and future pathway options. This information forms the basis of the timetable construction which will take the rest of the year to develop and complete in readiness for 2017.

Another aspect of our planning for the coming year is the development of our staffing profile. This includes identifying potential leadership and teacher vacancies. Currently we have flexibility within our leadership profile as two leaders (Kersten Stengel and Bronwyn Phillips) have moved to another site, having won promotional leadership positions. As a staff we are determining the 'new' leadership profile given this flexibility, however, for the rest of this year the following staff will provide leadership for the Middle School:

- Ilana Heapy Assistant Principal Middle School and Intervention and Support
- Kathryn Parry Leader Year 8 and Transition to High School
- Talia Vandyk Leader Year 9 and Student Leadership

Also, I would like to welcome Kathryn Harrison who has won the female Student Counsellor position for the rest of this year. Kathryn started with us in Week 3. In the short time Kathryn has been with us her priority has been to meet as many students and staff as possible. Kathryn is also available to meet with parents/caregivers if required. STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) Works

CBHS is one of 44 secondary sites to be allocated 2.5 million dollars to build/develop facilities to support students to engage in innovative STEM learning, as part of the 2016-2017 State Budget. This is an exciting development which will significantly benefit teaching and student learning at CBHS. The facility upgrade is to be completed by 2018 and we anticipate conversations will begin with architects in the near future.

Staff Professional Learning

This term staff have participated in two professional learning days – July 25 and August 24.

On July 25 all teaching staff from the Beach Road Partnership met as a collective group at Christies Beach Primary School. The purpose of this day was to reinforce the collective responsibility and accountability staff have for all learners birth to Year 12 in the Beach Road Partnership. This included a focus on our Partnership improvement agenda so that all teachers are clear about our core work (and role) as teachers within the Beach Road Partnership – that being literacy and numeracy improvement and developing powerful learners.

On August 24 the focus was on 'Comprehending Texts'. Stephen Graham, a literacy consultant from Victoria, worked with staff to explore successful strategies that help students to develop their reading comprehension skills. This day complemented staff learning from Term 2 which had a focus on strategies to support subject specific writing.

Finally, a reminder that the annual Arts Showcase is this Thursday evening at the Hopgood Theatre at Noarlunga Centre. The evening will showcase the wonderful talents of our students across the Arts Disciplines. I look forward to attending with the school community.

NAPLAN Online Trial – getting ready for 2017

The Australian Government is committed to delivering NAPLAN online from 2017, with all schools across the nation transitioning over a two to three year period.

This change will provide each child with a more personalised learning experience and a better assessment. It also means that the results will be returned to you and your child's teachers within a few weeks, rather than several months.

Students in Care Groups 903 and 904 participated in a trial of the new online system in Week 5 this term. This trial was not a 'test' of content; it was a test of how the new online system will work in a real-life classroom environment. You may have heard this trial referred to as the NAPLAN Online Readiness Trial. Each test took approximately 45 minutes and was held in the Trade Training Centre classrooms.

The students who participated are to be commended on their behaviour and commitment to helping with the trial.

This trial will help our site to be well prepared to complete NAPLAN online in 2017 and provide feedback into final changes at a state-wide level.

Subject Selection and Course Counselling for 2017

Course Counselling for 2017 was held this term during Week 4 with Year 10 and Year 11 students, parents and caregivers attending on Tuesday and Year 8 and Year 9 students, parents and caregivers attending on Thursday.

To support this process the lessons for each of these groups were cancelled on the day to release staff to hold interviews with each family.

Collecting this subject selection data is a crucial first step in the development of our 2017 timetable and staffing requirements.

To date 83% of students required to complete selections have done so through this process.

If you or your child have not completed the subject selection process at this time it is very important that you contact the school and meet with the relevant Year Level Leader to complete subject selections for 2017.

As we begin to build our timetable for 2017 some subjects will be rationalised and students re-counselled over the coming weeks. This may mean that options for students who have not completed subject selection will be reduced and some subjects will no longer be available.




Uniforms are available for sale from Student Services at CBHS which is open 8:00am - 4:00pm Monday - Friday.
